## **FRENECTOMY**

Post-Operative Care Instructions

- Do NOT eat anything until the anesthesia wears off, as you might bite your lips, cheek, or tongue and cause damage.
- Avoid sharp, spicy, and acidic foods / liquids for the first 72 hours.
- A "white soft scab" will appear for the first 7-10 days while the frenectomy site is healing.
- This is *not* an infection and is simply a covering over the healing soft tissue.
- Lasers are antibacterial so infection is very unlikely.
- · Warm salt water rinses
- but feel free to rinse gently with warm salt water.
- Mix one teaspoon of salt dissolved in a tall glass of warm water.
- Place a small amount of the warm salt water rinse and gently tilt your head side to side, moving the salt water around in your mouth.
- For the first 24 hours, cold beverages, ice, slushies, or popsicles can be applied gently to the surgical site to help minimize swelling.
- Brush your teeth normally being careful not to disrupt the soft tissue while it is healing.
- About 7-10 days after the frenectomy performed today, a short post-op visit will be necessary to evaluate healing.

## **Pain Management**

- Post-op discomfort will likely only be mild and can be managed with an over-the-counter medication. You may alternate Ibuprofen and Tylenol pain medications for better pain coverage.
  - Take Ibuprofen or Advil 800 mg (equal to 4 tabs of over-the-counter Ibuprofen or Advil) every 4-6 hours for the next 3-5 days as needed for pain.
    - Do NOT exceed 2400 mg (12 tabs) in a 24 hour period.
  - Take Extra Strength Tylenol 1000 mg (equal to 2 tabs of over-the-counter Extra Strength Tylenol) every 4-6 hours for the next 3-5 days as needed for pain.
    - Do NOT exceed 4000 mg (8 tabs) in a 24 hour period.
